First Aid Recommendations

- IN THE MOUTH**
Do not make the person vomit or give them anything to eat or drink.
- ON THE SKIN**
Rinse skin well with water. Then wash skin gently with soap and water.
- IN THE EYE**
Rinse eyes with water for 15 minutes. If you wear contact lenses, remove your contacts before rinsing. Blink eyes multiple times while rinsing.
- IN THE AIR**
Leave the area and seek fresh air.
